





10. Put a circle around the shapes below as you find them on your walk back to school.

Easter Trail


Along the route you will find pictures of rabbits each with a letter. Write down the letters below, then at the end of the trail, unscramble them to form two words.

Starting outside of the school, carefully cross the road onto the pavement and walk along to St James' Church.

1. Stand by the church wall so you can see the grave stones. Find the gravestone of John Clement Ollier. How long did he live? _____

Continue to walk along the pavement past the church. Turn left and follow the footpath over the bridge. Turn left past the tennis court and go into the Play Park.

2. Starting at one pair of benches find a route to the other pair of benches. During your journey from one pair of benches to the other you need to run around each piece of the playground equipment once and only once. Can you find a different route?





Go out of the park and turn right along the path by the Parish Hall to Mill Race Garden.

3. Keeping to the paths, find and name three different plants.

Walk up to the top of the steps.

Carefully cross Millfield Road, turn left and walk along the main road to Sandy Bank. Walk up Sandy Bank.


5. Count the number of gates on the way up to the top of the hill. _____
